

Free College Meals

To be eligible for Free College Meals you must be –

- Aged 16-18 on 31st August 2022 and enrolled in Further Education provision funded by the Education Funding Agency (not an Apprenticeship)
- Be in receipt of, or have parents who are in receipt of, one or more of the following benefits:
 - Income Support
 - Universal Credit with net earnings not exceeding the equivalent of £7,400 per annum (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
 - Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
 - Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit (but not entitled to Working Tax Credit and yearly income does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by HMRC)
 - Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for WTC)

You will be required to provide current evidence of receipt of the above.

If you are eligible you will receive £3.50 per day for each day you have timetabled lessons which will be pre-loaded onto your college ID card to be spent in the on-site catering facilities.

You can apply for Free College Meals via the Online Application Portal which will be available in the Student Services area on the college website from Thursday 25th August 2022.

VYP and 16-19 Bursary

For those students aged 16-18 there are 2 types of funding available (subject to eligibility criteria)

Vulnerable Young Persons Bursary (for students aged 16-18 on 31st August 2022)

You are eligible to apply if one of the following statements applies to you–

- You are in receipt of Income Support or Universal Credit because you are financially supporting yourself or supporting someone who is dependant on you eg child or partner
- You are in receipt of Employment Support Allowance **AND** Disability Living Allowance (Personal Independence Payment) in your own name
- You are in care or have recently left care

If the above criteria apply to you either at the start of your course or at any point during the year please do not hesitate to contact Student Services to apply for funding.

If you are eligible for VYP Bursary you will receive

- a fortnightly payment to help with the costs of coming to college
- a contribution to travel expenses if you are **not eligible** to apply for the free Greater Manchester Bus Pass 'Our Pass'
- a refund of the 'Our Pass' application fee
- £3.50 per day towards the cost of food at college (if you are not already eligible for via the Free College meals scheme) pre loaded each day onto your college ID card to be spent onsite
- 100% contribution to **compulsory course costs** during the year to a maximum combined value of £1200.

16-19 Bursary

Please Note: this fund is extremely limited and therefore **NO GUARANTEE** of funding can be made.

To be eligible for the bursary you must be –

- Aged 16-18 on 31st August 2022 and studying on an FE programme (not an Apprenticeship)
- Be in receipt of, or have parents who are in receipt of, one or more of the following **eligible benefits**:
 - Income Support
 - Universal Credit with net earnings not exceeding the equivalent of £7,400 per annum (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
 - Income-based Jobseekers Allowance
 - Income-related Employment and Support Allowance (ESA)
 - Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
 - Child Tax Credit (but not entitled to Working tax Credit and yearly income does not exceed £16,190 as assessed by HMRC)
 - Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for WTC)

You will be required to provide current evidence of receipt of the above.

OR

- Have a household income of less than £30,000 (**Current evidence will be required – please see separate Evidence Required for Bursary sheet for more information**)

Household income will be calculated using the following information (**evidence will be required**) –

- Tax Credits – Working Tax and Child Tax Credit – all pages of 2022/2023 Tax Credit Award Notice will be required
- Earnings / Wage – either 3 most recent pay slips, P60, end of year business accounts or taken from 2022/2023 Tax Credit Award Notice if preferred
- Income Support or Job Seekers Allowance
- Employment Support Allowance (Incapacity Benefit)
- Universal Credit
- Child Benefit

Personal Independence Payment (Disability Living Allowance) and the Disability Element of any Child Tax Credits will NOT be taken into account as part of household income – **please make us aware if this is part of any payment you receive as it is not always evident.**

Financial Support at Bury College 2022 / 2023

- **If you are eligible you will receive** (subject to meeting the required levels of attendance, behaviour, attitude and commitment)
- a contribution to travel expenses if you are **not eligible** to apply for the free Greater Manchester Bus Pass 'Our Pass'
- a refund of the 'Our Pass' application fee
- £3.50 per day towards the cost of food at college (if you are not already eligible via the Free College Meals scheme) pre loaded each day onto your college ID card to be spent on site
- Minimum 75% contribution to **compulsory course costs** eg compulsory uniform, equipment and **essential** trips (to a maximum value of £400)

You can apply for all types of Bursary via the Online Application Portal which will be available in the Student Services area of the college website from Thursday 25th August 2022.

Terms and Conditions of Payment for all Bursaries

You are **NOT eligible** for funding if –

- you are studying on a waged Apprenticeship or Higher Education course
- you have been released on temporary license from prison or young offender institution
- you are receiving support through Additional Learning Support for the same purpose.

Bursary funds will only be awarded provided the student –

- meets the application criteria and has provided all relevant information / documents requested
- applies before the closing date for applications (if applicable)

Receipt of fortnightly payments will be based on –

- at least 90% overall attendance
- attendance at compulsory Maths and English classes (GCSE &/or Functional Skills) and work experience placements
- satisfactory behaviour, attitude and commitment including being up to date with work

16-18 Bursary funds are extremely limited and therefore NO GUARANTEE of funding can be made during the later stages of the year.

Payments are made directly into Student Bank Accounts so it is advisable to ensure you have an account open **before** you apply – bank account name **must** match the name in which you are enrolled at college.

Applications will be available via the Online Application Portal in the Student Services area on the college website from **Thursday 25th August 2022**

Applications will be processed in the order that they are received, fully completed with all necessary evidence (subject to availability of funds)

Childcare for Students aged 16-20

If you start your course before your 20th birthday, you are entitled to apply to Care to Learn for support with your childcare costs.
