#### What to expect whilst studying

A typical week on a full-time university course will include approximately 12 hours spent in classes, with additional hours to be spent on independent research and study.

Part-time students may spend between 4-8 hours of their time in tutor-led classes.

Whilst all our courses require you to work independently outside of lectures, please be assured our supportive tutors will be on hand throughout your time with us to advise and provide one-to-one feedback.

### Student Engagement

At Bury College University Centre we believe strongly in the student voice and student engagement.

Students play a big part in the running of their courses and contribute to the way courses are managed.

Bury College University Centre holds regular Student Rep meetings where aspects such as learning, teaching assessments and curriculum are discussed. As a result of these meetings, positive solutions are implemented and changes are made.

#### What's in it for you?

You will develop important skills such as:

- Problem solving
- Researching the views of others
- Team work
- Communication
- Clearly putting across your views
- Presentation skills
- Building on your self-confidence

You will also be able to use the experience on your CV.

#### What's involved?

The role of a course rep is an important one as you are representing the views of everyone on your course. In particular, your responsibilities will include:

- Representing views and opinions of everyone on your course on a range of issues relating to university courses at Bury College
- Attending and taking part in the university student rep meetings once every half-term where you will discuss these issues with Bury College University Centre staff
- Making suggestions on how to improve the learner experience and work with the university team to implement these
- Informing everyone on your course about what happens at the university student rep meetings and the decisions that have been made
- Working with other university course reps

### The Role of Your Personal Tutor

Your Personal Tutor will act as your first point of contact, offering you guidance, support and encouragement. They will also provide the following:



- Help in identifying and reducing any possible barriers to your learning and where necessary direct you to any specialist services if required.
- Support and refer learners with additional learning support needs.
- An opportunity to complete an assessment to establish any level of support required - whether this be informal or formal.
- Encouragement to develop independent learning skills and selfmanagement.
- An opportunity to discuss academic progress in general including your attendance and punctuality, to monitor and help to improve your learner journey.
- Assist you in reflecting on your progress and work with you to set actions and targets.
- Help you plan and prepare for progression.



### Support

Our students are extremely important to us and we want to support and help you to have the best possible experience at Bury College University Centre.

### Learner Support

Each student is entitled to an initial assessment and subsequent meetings are planned around the student's timetable.

One-to-one support is also available for students with specific needs. Support will be available from individual tutors and at a curriculum level on the various modules available within the course. Extensive study supporting literature is available in the Library Resource Centres.

## Support for Students with Disabilities, Learning Difficulties or Specific Needs

Bury College University Centre welcomes students with disabilities and/or additional support requirements and will make every effort to support their needs. We will help you to develop strategies, discover skills and independence by a multi-team, student-centred approach. We encourage you to work with us to achieve your full potential. #### Counselling

## Additional pastoral support

- Support for general medical, physical, hearing or visual disability, study skills or dyslexia may be available.
- Our pastoral support team deals with student behaviour, performance and personal issues. They also work to ensure that students receive appropriate support and that facilities and services meet their needs. They are always willing to answer questions and discuss issues.

### Sorting your finances

Bury College University College has lower fees than most universities, with no up-front fees to be paid on full and part-time courses. Many students studying higher education are eligible for some form of financial assistance.

The main costs of studying a university course are tuition fees and living costs and there are loans available from Student Finance England to help with these.

#### **Fees**

Full-time course fees are currently £8250. For part-time fees please see our website for the latest information at www.burycollege.ac.uk/university-centre/supporting-you/fees-and-funding

#### **Tuition Fee loans**

Full and part-time students are able to pay course fees using a tuition fee loan, which you don't have to start paying back until you are earning £26,000\* or more. Your tuition fee loan will be paid directly to Bury College University Centre.

#### **Bursary**

Bury College University Centre is able to offer additional support if you are progressing directly from a Bury College Level 3 full-time course onto a full-time course at Bury College University Centre.

The £500 bursary will be paid each academic year of your course in two instalments and will be available to assist you during your time with us. For full details and conditions please visit www.burycollege.ac.uk/ university-centre/supporting-you/fees-and-funding

#### Maintenance loan

Maintenance loans are available to help full-time students with the cost of living whilst studying and unlike the tuition loan you will personally receive this money at the start of each term.

## Brand new Hair and Beauty Centre



#### What do I need to do before I start?

- Accept your offer of a place. If you are a full-time student, once you
  have received your offer from us you will need to let UCAS know you
  wish to accept. UCAS will let you know the deadline by which you need
  to choose your FIRM (first choice) and INSURANCE (second choice)
  place of study. UCAS will then notify us.
- Apply for student finance online at: www.gov.uk/student-finance
- Work out what your living costs will be including cost of books and equipment for your course and plan a weekly budget.
- Complete research on student bank accounts.
- Think about getting a summer job to help you save money.
