(ESOL course will study additional hours of English)

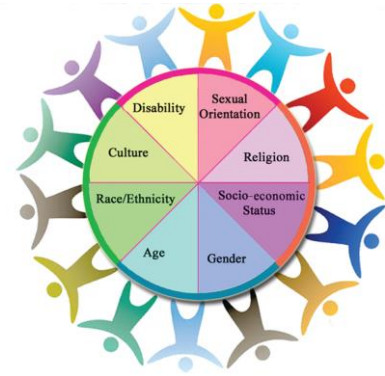
# GCSE English and maths

- If you achieve a grade 2 or 3 GCSE you will continue to study GCSE maths and English and will work to improve your grade
- If you achieve a Level 1 Functional Skills qualification you will work towards a GCSE

# Functional Skills maths and English

- If you have no previous maths and English qualification or achieve an Entry 1 or Entry 2 qualification you will work towards Entry Level Functional Skills at either Entry 1, Entry 2 or Entry 3.
- If you achieve an Entry Level 3 qualification you will work towards Level 1 Functional Skills
