HOW TO PREPARE FOR YOUR FIRST DAY

PLAN YOUR ROUTE

You can reach Bury College by car, bus, and tram. The college is only a short walk from Bury Interchange, making public transport an easy and quick way to get into college.

Many Bury College students are entitled to apply for an Our Pass card, which allows you to travel anywhere in Greater Manchester free of charge, at any time. For students who do not live in Greater Manchester, and therefore do not qualify for the Our Pass card, Bury College offers a free return coach service running in the following areas: Bolton, Littleborough, Moston, Rawtenstall.

Familiarising yourself with the best route into college before your first day will help you arrive on time and feel confident. Transport for Greater Manchester have resources for journey planning to help with this:

Alternatively there are plenty of food outlets in Bury town centre for you to enjoy.



WHAT'S ON IN BURY

The Bury College campus is only a stone's throw away from Bury town centre, giving you quick access to a variety of shops, restaurants, and entertainment venues.

EATING AND DRINKING

There are plenty of places to grab a bite to eat either over your lunch break or once you have finished your classes for the day. There are bistros and canteens throughout the college campus. You may also wish to visit the centre of Bury to get something quick to eat, or have a sit-down meal at any of the many restaurants.

SHOPPING

There are a variety of different places to shop in the centre of Bury, including two shopping centres, the Millgate and The Rock. Here, there are high street shops and department stores. You will be able to take advantage of a student discount on your purchases, and The Rock regularly give students huge discounts on their Student Savings Nights.

There are also charity shops and independent stores throughout Bury.

Bury Market Hall is open Monday to Saturday, and the Open Market Days are Wednesdays, Fridays, and Saturdays.





INFORMATION AND ADVICE

Our Student Services team will work with you, alongside the National Careers Service, to provide you with advice and information to ensure you are on the right path. The team can identify your skills and interests, assist with your career plans, higher education applications, or apprenticeships, and provide CV and interview-skills help.

STUDENT SAFEGUARDING AND WELFARE

Bury College has a dedicated team for student welfare and safeguarding which helps to keep you and your classmates safe. If you would like to speak with a member of the team, please contact them on 07713312773 or email safeguarding@burycollege.ac.uk.

You will also have access to our Counselling and Wellbeing team, who are on hand to support you with issues such as stress, anxiety, personal relationships, and general wellbeing.

Support is available via drop-ins or pre-arranged appointments, on a one-to-one basis or through groupwork sessions.

ADDITIONAL LEARNING SUPPORT (ALS)

For students who require extra help for any reason, including learning disabilities/ difficulties or language proficiency, the ALS team can provide bespoke support to ensure that you are in the best position to succeed on your chosen course. The ALS team includes Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Advisory tutors who work with designated curriculum areas in supporting students.

The SEND Advisory tutors are based in the Millennium Centre in the Personalised Learning Centre. All students are welcome to visit to discuss any issues that they may be facing.

LIBRARY RESOURCE CENTRES

Our Library Resource Centres are available for all students to use. Enjoy our wide range of books, DVDs and resources to help with your studies or to use in your leisure time. There are over 150 computers, including Apple Macs, and free Wi-Fi for you to use.



There are a variety of financial support mechanisms available for students who may experience financial difficulty while at Bury College.

Loans and bursaries can include:

- 19+ Learner Support Funds
- 19+ Advanced Learner Loan Bursary
- 16-19 bursaries
- Free college meals
- Support with travel costs
- Care to Learn (for young parents aged 16-19)

This support can help you with the costs of attending college, such as transport, college equipment, meals, books, trips, specialised kits and other course related costs.

OUR PASS

Many Bury College students are entitled to apply for an Our Pass card, which allows you to travel anywhere in Greater Manchester free of charge, at any time. This free bus travel card is available to all 16 to 18-year-old students who live in Greater Manchester and can be used to travel to and from Bury College free of charge, as well as allowing students the freedom to travel throughout Greater Manchester at the weekends. 16-25 RAILCARD


Save on travel with the 16-25 railcard, available for anyone from 16-25, or over 25 and in full-time education. The card is £30 per year and offers a third off most train fares.
