# **Planning for Exams**

The exam board for Sociology is AQA.

You will sit 3 two-hour exams at the end of the two-year programme. Most of your in-class assessment will take the form of exam-style questions and you will sit progression exams at the end of the first year. During Year 2 you will sit mock exams.
